

**BC EVENTING 'GET BACK AT IT' CLINIC 2021** 

Due to COVID 19 preventing us from running any spring clinics this year, BCEA will be hosting two 2 day back to back clinics over the August 6 to 9 'weekend' at Chase Creek Eventing. These will be combined adult and young rider clinics and are organized by the education, adult rider and young rider committees of BCEA. The clinic dates are August 6-7 and August 8-9. As this camp is the weekend prior to Campbell Valley Horse Trials, preference for the August 8 to 9 clinic will be given to riders from Vancouver Island, the Kootenays or Northern BC who will be travelling on to Campbell Valley Horse Trials on August 13 to 15 2021. Riders in the August 6 to 7 clinic will leave after riding on August

7<sup>th</sup>. Riders in the August 8-9 clinic should try to arrive no earlier than 4:00 on August 7<sup>th</sup>.

These clinics are open to all BCEA members (regular & non-competitive supporting members regardless of age or level of competition.

The non-competitive supporting membership (NCSM) was new in 2020. It allows participation in ALL BCEA Clinics and Camps (Education, Adult Riders and Young Riders) and gives you voting rights. It is available for purchase for \$25 on the HCBC website when you purchase your Horse Council membership. This membership does NOT allow for participation in competitions.

To participate in these clinics all BC riders must obtain either a full or non-competitive supporting membership for BC Eventing Association. This can be done online at <u>www.hcbc.ca.</u> Horse Council membership (or other province equivalent) is also mandatory for all riders at all levels. Out of province riders add \$25 to clinic registration fee.

**NOTE**: The appropriate **ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY** form must be signed and initialed. One form is for adults over the age of majority (age 19 on or before January 1 2021) and the other must be completed by a parent or guardian for riders who have not reached the age of majority.

*Pace Work Clinic -* Each rider will be given one time slot to practice pace work – this will be timed to start 30 minutes prior to one of your cross country lessons and will be the warm up for your lesson – the pace work lesson is included in your clinic entry fee

*Dressage Lessons available* – 30-minute private dressage lessons taught by Sue Hewton-Waters are also offered for an additional \$65. These will be filled on a 1<sup>st</sup> come 1<sup>st</sup> served basis

## All Entry Forms, Fees & Waivers must accompany your entry

To avoid additional fees, enter by the closing date of July 27<sup>th</sup> 2021. Late entries, if accepted, will be charged a \$25 late fee. Early entries are appreciated. A \$30 administration fee will be retained for cancellations. A medical certificate may be required.

## **Other Important Clinic Information**

**In order to participate in this clinic, you must be prepared to ride out of an arena, in a group, over uneven terrain**. The clinic (all levels) will be cross-country instruction with some warm up in stadium. The length of time spent in stadium instruction will be decided by clinicians, based on competency level of participants. Groups will be of 4 to 6 riders and will be 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> to 2 hours in length.

BC Eventing committees do our best to provide clinicians who uphold our philosophy and mission statement. If your clinic experience is not meeting your expectations, we encourage you to discuss your concerns with the onsite BCEA representative (Debbie Dorosh) after your first lesson.

If you have any medical concerns that we should be aware of please indicate this with your entry <u>and</u> advise the onsite representative BEFORE you get on your horse.

**YOUNG RIDERS** If you joined the Young Riders program and paid for your membership in 2020 or 2021 and have either a full or non-competitive BCEA membership, please deduct \$25 from your clinic entry

Requests will be met to the best of the entry secretary's ability, beginning with the highest-level riders and early entries. However please note **you may not get your requested clinician.** All are welcome to observe all groups.

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
